

- Assess their offering, identifying key strengths and limitations of products or services, advising on how to make adjustments to scale up solutions across the health care system.
- Understand the elements of an evaluation that demonstrate the potential for products to be scaled up at a provincial level.



Who is eligible?

Small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) do not need to pay for attending the program but must meet the following eligibility criteria to be considered for this service:

- There is one or more full-time equivalent employee(s) on the company payroll;
- There are no more than 500 employees;
- The firm operates from a professional space;
- The firm is Canadian and has a Canada Revenue Agency Business number.

What do you get?

- Clients will receive up to 2 meetings with WIHV (in Toronto, or virtually), in addition to a recommendations document that directly addresses any concerns they have around barriers to integrating their product in the system.
- Limited access to a pool of advisors, including clinicians, health system policy advisors, venture capital professionals, disease specific content experts, and virtual care evaluation experts.





How much does it cost?

There is **no cost** to the SME for this service. however, the number of placements is limited. The program is run on a first come, first serve basis.
